Stefan Speck is working at the European Environment Agency (EEA) in Copenhagen responsible for environmental economics and policies. He holds a PhD in economics from Keele University in England. Prior to his employment at the EEA, he worked as a senior consultant at Kommunalkredit Public Consulting in Austria and as a senior project scientist at the National Environmental Research Institute/University of Aarhus in Denmark.

His research focuses on the application of market-based instruments (MBIs) for environmental policy and environmental fiscal reform. He was part of the research team of the EU-funded project 'Competitiveness Effects of Environmental Tax Reforms' (COMETR) and contributed to the research project 'Resource Productivity, Environmental Tax Reform and Sustainable Growth in Europe' (PETRE) funded by the Anglo-German Foundation. At the EEA he is leading the work on green economy. In the past he implemented projects for a range of clients including the European Commission (EC), Organisation of Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), United Nations Environmental Programme (UNEP), German Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation and Nuclear Safety, Danish Environmental Protection Agency (DEPA), and the UK Department for International Development (DFID). He carried out research projects in Europe, Africa and Asia.

He published widely on environmental fiscal reform and green economy; he was co-editor of the books Environmental Fiscal Mechanism and Reform for Low Carbon Development: East Asia and Europe (2013), Environmental Tax Reform: A Policy for Green Growth (2011) and was the lead author of the EEA report Resource-efficient green economy and EU policies (2014).
